

What steps is Guardian Swim School taking during COVID-19 to keep guests safe?

At Guardian Swim School, the safety of our guests and team members is our top priority!

We are following all the safety guidelines outlined by the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) - <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/parks-rec/aquatic-venues.html>

The CDC issued guidance that it is safe to swim as the virus cannot be spread via properly chlorinated and maintained pool water. Guardian Swim School is up to date on all health standards set by the CDC and will be testing our pool chemistry every 2 hours to ensure all chemical levels are meeting standards and expectations.

What we are doing:

- Ensuring that all team members are wearing personal protective equipment (Gloves & face masks).
- Staff will be doing thorough cleaning in between each class, in the lobby, changing rooms, and pool area.
- Limiting the number of classes being conducted at a time to allow more space between each swimmer.
- The use of pool toys in our lessons is being scaled back and all toys and equipment that may be used will be disinfected between uses.
- Candy has been put away to prevent the spread of germs.
- Hand sanitizer will remain available throughout the facility.
- Chairs in the observation rooms and pool deck will be placed 6 feet apart to enforce social distancing.

What we ask of you:

- All Parents and children are required to wear a face mask when not on the pool deck.
- Please bring your own goggles. For the time being, Guardian Swim School will no longer let children borrow goggles. For your convenience, we will have goggles for sale at the reception desk.
- One parent per child is allowed inside the swim school. No exceptions.
- We ask that students arrive only five minutes before their scheduled class time to keep occupancy numbers within guidelines and walkways clear. Likewise, please exit the building as soon as possible following your child's lesson to assist us in delivering classes on time for the next session.
